Leave cases in vehicle, with audience or at Info Table ~ not by/on stage
Restrooms, Bus parking behind Band Shell ~ Car/van parking underground

3:45 Stage Left (audience right): 4 enter-set-tune-warm-perform to 5 pm
Exit Stage Right ~ put folder on stack ~ 2 photographs with instruments

Audience has benches only. Bring folding chairs, pillows, blankets, etc.

CDs \$12.50 if prepaid for group order before 6/13 ~ pay & signup 6/2—9.

The **parking** garage is under the Music Concourse near the California Academy of Science and the Band Shell where we will be playing. The price is \$3.25 per hour, so carpooling is strongly encouraged if your band has not chartered a bus. To get to the garage, head west on Lincoln toward the ocean and turn right on 9th. Look for the sign pointing to the garage on your right about three blocks off Lincoln. Take the ramp down into the garage. Park in the area closest to where you entered. The door leading directly to the Music Concourse will be on your left. Take note of how your parking ticket is to be paid for. If you want to go to the de Young or California Academy of Sciences before or afterwards, you can walk to them from the concert area.

All large percussion equipment is being provided both days, as requested by the bands. The unloading and reloading of other larger items could be as simple as pulling up behind the Band Shell, unloading, and then moving the vehicle to the parking garage. But the parking garage is close to the Band Shell. If people really need to pull up behind the Band Shell to unload, they should call 925-321-3149 about 5 minutes before they pull up, and we will have someone go behind the Band Shell to unlock the barrier. Cases should be left in your vehicles, in the audience area with family or friends, or by the Festival Information Table. Cases should not be brought onto the stage area.

Benches are provided for the **audience**. People should bring blankets or folding chairs only if they want to sit on something softer than the cedar benches. **Rest rooms** are located behind the Band Shell.

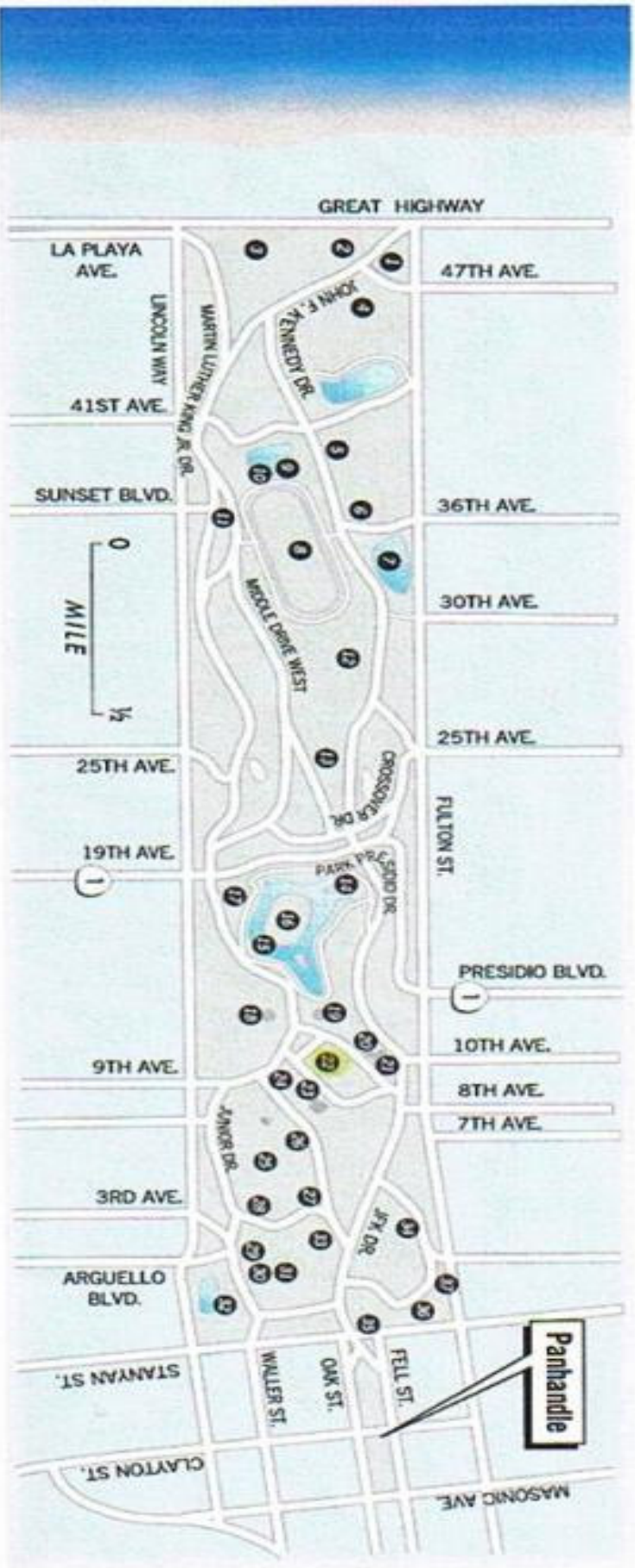
The closest **food** is at the de Young Café, which can be entered directly from the outside without going through the Museum. It is very nice and has an outdoor dining area, from which you can hear the bands. The Café offers soup, salads, sandwiches, and more. There are many fine restaurants with moderate pricing along 9th Avenue and Irving Street just outside the Park about three blocks south of the Band Shell. You are welcome to bring your own food and non-alcoholic beverages.

We will have the **Festival Information Table** during the entire Festival. Programs will be available there as well as other relevant information. If you would like to put out brochures about your band and/or flyers for your band's upcoming concerts, please bring a supply with you and give them to a person at the Table. The Golden Gate Park Band historic t-shirts and the 2010 Festival t-shirts will be for sale at a cost of \$15 each (cash or check payable to the *San Francisco Parks Trust*). The book, *Five Thousand Concerts in the Park: The History of the Golden Gate Park Band*, will be available for sale at a discount from the regular price. We will also have our lost-and-found station there.

The performances will be recorded on **CDs**. An order form from Hear & Now Audio is in this packet. Extra order forms will be at the Festival Information Table. Please encourage your band members to order them in advance. They can submit their order and payment at the Festival Information Table or mail them after the Festival to Hear & Now Audio.
